Summary of Review of NCACs (9/2016)

Background

- Active ACs
 - Crop and Soil Research, Animal Health Advisory Committee, Horticultural Crops, Livestock Production, Agricultural Economics, Plant Pathology, Entomology and Economic Zoology, Biological and Agricultural Engineering, Food Science and Human Nutrition, Agricultural Education Research
- Terminated ACs
 - Human Sciences, Forestry and Forest Products, Rural Sociology, Fisheries and Wildlife
- Responsibilities
 - Rate all ongoing projects/committees under their purview
 - o Identify apparent duplication in the multistate research program
 - Characterize future multistate research needs
 - o Review proposals for NC and NCCC/NCERA activities
 - Review requests for continuation of ongoing activities
 - Conduct critical midterm evaluations of NC projects and NCERAs/NCCCs during the third year of existence
 - ACs charged to look at meeting minutes and AA evaluations as a guide to their review (self-fulfilling prophecy?)

General Observations

- -This AC Review solely based upon the respective AC Annual Meeting minutes for the last 7 years (if available)
- -Extremely wide range of information provided
- -Speculation is that they function as they have been generally functioning throughout their existence
- -Participation by the AA and the NIFA representatives are highly variable and generally poor
- -Their meeting times may or may not coincide with MRC and NCRA needs for project review
- -The number of NC projects that each AC could be assigned is wide ranging; There are a number of NC projects that are not directly connected to an AC as well
- -Some ACs have only NC participation, while others have more of a national perspective; Several ACs have met with other regions ACs (Southern)
- -Most ACs meet in conjunction with another activity (professional society, allied committees, federal agencies, regional branch meetings); some reviews take place by phone
- -Some ACs provide a detailed meeting agenda that goes way beyond the multistate project review and some have none

<u>Needs</u>

- MRC and NCRA Office review and provide guidance to ACs for implementation in 2017 and beyond?
 Question the ACs on their level of interest to continue. Consider review alternatives and so on.
 Should we routinely ask them questions to get 'stakeholder' input and other ideas for director consideration?
- If we improve on the ACs, <u>theoretically</u> it will help MRC/NCRA functions and all of the way through national impact statements across multistate committees
- Primer/review of purpose, activities and opportunities with ACs to include how to and what is needed for a review
- Revisit AAs?

- Potential added-value discussions to ACs (examples)
 - o Share best practices; Future professional discipline issues
 - Collaboration and cooperation across states and regions; Where appropriate there may be interest from other non-LGUs and ARS to participate
 - o Meet in conjunction with federal/state agencies and/or professional societies
 - Faculty evaluations, salary inversion/compression strategies, evaluations of team efforts, 9 vs 12 month appointments, learning outcomes, development activities, state reports, tours
 - o Combining departments and creating business service centers; Conducting department reviews
 - o Development of shared courses and on-line programs
 - o Creation of alternative revenue streams
 - o Pre- and post-grant award services both at department and college levels
 - o Diversity with undergraduate and graduate students, and faculty
 - o International collaborative opportunities
